Numeracy

This term we will be developing our skills on a range of topics, including fractions, decimals and percentages, measures and statistics. We will also be having lots of fun by baking after SATs week and making sugar cube towers whilst solving problems. We will continue to extend and build on our knowledge by continuing with our guided reasoning and mastery lessons.

DECIMALS

Geography

Our geography topic this term is the Arctic and the Antarctic. The children will find out what the climate is like, if people live there and what types of animals live at the north and South Pole. The children will be writing a report about the Arctic in our geography lessons. They will also be building igloos (small versions!) using polystyrene cubes in our D&T lessons. Our art work will also be linked to this topic.

Religious Education
