ANNUAL REPORT ON THE USE OF PUPIL PREMIUM SEPTEMBER 2016-17

What is the Premium?

The Pupil Premium is funding which are given to schools for pupils known to be eligible for free school meals and for children who had been looked after continuously by the Local Authority for more than six months,

HOW MUCH PUPIL PREMIUM FUNDING DO SCHOOL RECEIVE?

The level of the premium set for 2016 -17 was £660 per pupil for pupils eligible for free school meals and for pupils in care. Eligibility for the Pupil Premium for has been extended to pupils who have been eligible for free school meals at any time in the last six years.
