NURSERY RHYMES

This half term we will be singing lots of different Nursery Rhymes, gaining more independence and building relationships with others. We will be making spiders, buses and using instruments to create Music. We will be learning both inside and outside and have access to a range of topic based resources such as Transport and Autumn. We will be developing our fine motor skills by painting, mark making and threading beads and shapes.

Phonics and reading

Every day children will take part in small listening activities and games. This is Phase 1 of the letters and sounds scheme, which includes rhyming, exploring with instruments and listening to the sounds in our environment.

Children will have an activity in their home school book each week and it is important to read with your child as much as possible at home.

Number fun

Our Maths learning will focus on counting, getting different amounts, talking about size and position and beginning to recognise different shapes in our environment.

Reminders

- Make sure your child's clothes including shoes and especially jumpers have their name in it. This will save us a lot of time. Thank you.
- Please ensure your child has a coat, appropriate footwear and outdoor clothing in school each day due to our outdoor learning in Nursery.
- Your child needs spare clothes (it doesn't have to be uniform) in school in case of a variety of accidents, for example drink spills. Please ensure these are named and in a bag. These clothes can be left in school.

Please listen to your child read each night and complete the home school activity they will get on a Friday. Home school books should be returned to school on Wednesdays.
