Wednesday: Today is the last day for homework to be handed in.

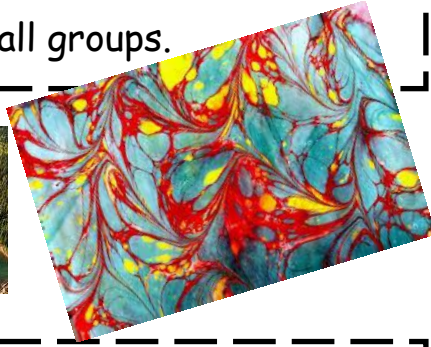
Wednesday: PE kits are needed today.
