


RE

Welcome back to school and to the New Year. We continue to be very busy in school continuing planning and delivering a stimulating curriculum for your child. We value your continued support during the spring term. Please take a few moments to read this newsletter.

In Literacy this term we will be focusing on performance poetry. We will be exploring nonfiction texts about old toys and materials then writing reports about what we find out.

Later in the term we will be reading a variety of narrative texts and writing our own stories.

Reading and phonics play a very important role in your child's ability to write well. We encourage the children to read for enjoyment, whether it be a book, comic, take away menu or bus time table. Try to encourage your child to read additional books at home and ask your child questions about what they have read.

There will be a greater emphasis on applying **spellings, punctuation and grammar** skills in all areas of writing this term, as well as continuing to focus on presentation.



Countdown

In maths we will be focusing on applying multiplication and division facts in problem solving. Our daily practise in 'Rock Star Times Tables' will start this term. We will continue to develop our skills of adding and subtracting two 2-digit numbers and the methods used.

We will be using money, shape, and measures including time in problem solving.

Children need to learn their number bonds to 10 and 20, and their times tables, 2s, 3s, 5s, and 10s.



Science Professor!

Materials

We will be identifying and comparing the suitability of everyday materials including wood, metal, plastic, brick rock, paper, and cardboard for specific uses.

We will look at the properties of some materials and explain why an object is made of a certain material. We will identify materials that are transparent, translucent or opaque.

Animals including Humans

In class we will be comparing the different stages of development for humans and animals and what they need to survive.
