This week we will be looking at the story 'The Three Little Pigs'. You can find the story on youtube:

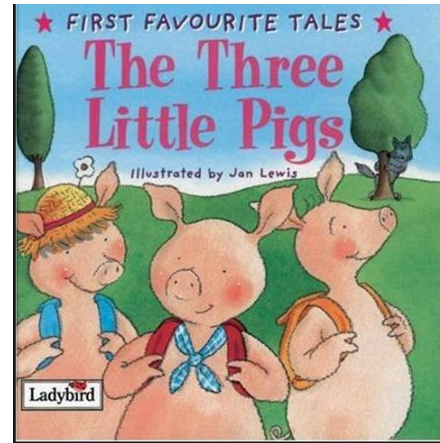

Literacy:

This week I would like you to:

1. Listen to the story very carefully and read it together with your family.
2. Talk about the pictures on the video/ in the book. What do you think might happen next?
3. Talk about **who** is in the story (characters) and how the characters feel. Why do they feel this way?
4. Talk about the **beginning**, **middle** and **end** of the story. What happens at the **end** of the story?
5. **Retell** the story without looking at the pictures. You could act the story out and ask family members to become different characters.



Story map

I have attached a story map with pictures on the website. Try to sequence the story by ordering the pictures correctly. Can you talk about each picture? If you do not have a printer to do this I will leave the pictures inside your learning pack.

Beginning, middle and end

Can you draw a picture of what happens at the beginning, middle and end of the story? Again, this printout is in your learning pack.

Maths:

Can you practice counting to 10/ 20? Here are the links for the Jack Hartmann songs that we love in Nursery:

1. Can you practice recognising numerals 1-5/ 1-10. You could point to a number and say the name or somebody can ask you to point to a certain number. We need to keep practicing recognising numbers as it will help us with lots of our Maths skills! There are some number cards on the website and in your packs.
2. Can you practice counting the characters from the story? Remember that 'how many' is the number you have counted to.

4. Ask your parents to get two different amounts of objects, one for you and one for them. This could be forks, cups, shoes, toys or cakes! Can you say who has **more**? Can you check by counting? Which is the bigger number?

Creative:

Paper, cardboard boxes, toilet roll tubes, collage materials, lollysticks, lego bricks, even pillows and cushions to create a house! You could add a label onto your creation too.
