<ul> <li>In maths we will be:</li> <li>Multiplying and dividing numbers up to 4 digit numbers by one and two digit numbers using a formal written method.</li> <li>Multiplying and dividing numbers mentally and developing mental strategies.</li> <li>Identifying and naming equivalent fractions of a given fraction, represented visually, including tenths and hundredths.</li> <li>Writing equivalent fractions of a given fraction, represented visually, including tenths.</li> <li>Comparing and ordering fractions whose denominators are all multiples of the same number.</li> <li>Recognising mixed numbers and improper fractions and converting from one form to the other and write mathematical statements &gt; 1 as a mixed number e.g. 2/5 + 4/5 = 6/5 = 11/5.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>In history/geography we will be:</li> <li>Explaining when and where the Vikings came from and why they raided Britain.</li> <li>Comparing the significance of some Anglo- Saxon kings during the Viking period.</li> <li>Explaining who King Ethelred II was and say when and why Danegeld was introduced.</li> <li>Identifying and explaining key aspects of Viking life.</li> <li>Explaining how the legal system worked in Anglo-Saxon and Viking Britain.</li> <li>Explaining how the last Anglo-Saxon kings shaped Britain.</li> </ul>
