# Autumn 2:

Welcome back! I hope you all had a lovely holiday and are ready for even more fun learning activities to take place.

- Make sure your child's clothes including shoes and especially jumpers have their name in it. This will save us a lot of time. Thank you.
- Please ensure your child has a coat, appropriate footwear and outdoor clothing in school each day due to our outdoor learning in Nursery.

- Please provide a t-shirt, jogging bottoms or leggings and trainers for our PE lessons.

Theme: This half term our big question is "Why do we celebrate special days?"

Personal, social and emotional development:

This half term we will be continuing to develop our independence skills, talking about our emotions and making friendships.

## Communication and language:

This half term we will be developing our language skills by sharing news, playing lots of games and talking about how we celebrate special days at home.

We will read and act out lots of new stories and learn lots of new vocabulary.

We will be learning to speak to one person, in small groups and in large groups.

We will be using our imagination a lot to imagine lots of different things.

#### Physical development:

We will be playing lots of games that encourage us to move around in lots of different ways confidently. We will be learning to ride a balance bike. We will play lots of games where we have to work together as a team.

# Writing:

During our Literacy Sessions we will listen to a variety of different stories including Happy Birthday Maisy, we will be learning to draw recognisable pictures by drawing shapes, learning to write our name and learning to add marks to our work to represent writing, for example, writing a shopping list for a party.

# Nursery



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#### Numbers:

Our maths learning will focus on learning about the numbers 1-5, representing numbers in lots of different ways, for example dots on a dice, recognising quantities up to 3 without counting them.

We will do this through daily counting and lots of practical, fun learning activities.

# Numerical patterns:

We will be talking about 2D shapes, positional language. We will also be practising sorting objects, matching objects and making our very own patterns.

# Understanding the world:

During our topic sessions we will

- learning about Diwali, Bonfire Night,
  Remembrance Day, Hanukkah, birthdays,
  Christenings and welcoming babies into the World,
  Weddings and Christmas.
- We will be sharing how we celebrate special days with our families, including Eid.
- We will explore the differences and similarities between each special day
- We will talk about familiar experiences with each other such as going on holiday

## Expressive arts and design:

We will be learning to take part in imaginative play, making creations from different materials including clay and learning how to create different colours by colour mixing.

# Class dojo

As a school we use class dojo as a reward system and to keep in contact with parents and carers. Your child will come home with their own login details for class dojo and you can see messages from myself, photographs of any work and homework that I would like you to do.

You can also add photographs and messages about all the wonderful things that you do at home; maybe you have been baking or been on a day out? Whatever you wish to share you are more than welcome to we would love to see them.

Only the adults in school can see what you have posted onto class dojo as it is only linked to your child's name.

#### **VIPS**

Each half term we will hold a VIP session in small groups so that you can look at your child's work, ask any questions or talk about any concerns that you may have, and staff will give you information about how to help your child with their learning at home.
