Theme: This half term our big question is "How do I grow?"

Personal, social and emotional development:	Physical development:
This half term we will be learning how to solve problems and think about how others might feel.	We will be playing lots of games that encourage us to move around in lots of different ways confidently. We will be riding a balance bike and scooters. We will play lots of games where we have to work together as a team.
Communication and language: This half term we will be developing our language skills by sharing news, playing lots of games and talking about our experiences of plants and animals and how they grow We will read and act out lots of new stories and learn lots of new vocabulary. We will be learning to speak to one person, in small groups and in large groups. We will be using our imagination a lot to imagine lots of different things.	Writing: During our Literacy Sessions we will listen to a variety of different stories including The Very Hungry Caterpillar and The Ugly Duckling, we will be learning to draw recognisable pictures by drawing shapes, learning to write our name and learning to add marks to our work to represent writing, for example, writing labels for animal pictures

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Numbers: Our maths learning will focus on learning about comparing numbers 1-5, how to make the numbers 4 and 5. We will be learning what 0 is. We will do this through daily counting and lots of practical, fun learning activities.	Numerical patterns: We will be talking about prepositions, describing journeys, length, weight and combining shapes
<ul> <li>Understanding the world:</li> <li>During our topic sessions we will</li> <li>learn how to plant bulbs and seeds. We will talk about what we notice about the seeds and bulbs and we will sort them.</li> <li>Learn about different plant and animal lifecycles including how we grow from a baby to an adult.</li> <li>Learn what plants and animals need to grow</li> <li>Learn the different parts of plants.</li> <li>Going to a farm</li> <li>Learning baby and mummy animal names</li> </ul>	Expressive arts and design: We will be learning to take part in imaginative play, making creations from different materials including junk modelling resources and how to join them and we will be continuing to learn how to create different colours by colour mixing.
