

## **Ashton West End Academy Primary School**

### **The PE and Sports Premium Funding Report 2022-23**

The government is providing funding for the academic years 2022/2023 to provide substantial Primary School Sport Funding. The premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, in the 2022 to 2023 academic year, to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

The allocation of the yearly Sports Funding is paid in instalments over two financial years. This is the same way as the DfE are passing the funding onto Local Authorities.

**The DfE have stipulated that the following conditions must be met by all schools in receipt of the grant:**

- The premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, in the 2022 to 2023 academic year, to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.
- Maintained schools must publish, on their website, information about their use of the PE and Sport Grant allocation. Schools should publish the amount of grant received; how it has been spent (or will be spent) and what impact the school has seen on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment as a result, to help to ensure that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles.
